

# Rotary Sunrise Board Meeting Summary – 2/10/26

## Quick recap

The board meeting focused on approving the bylaws for a new Rotary Companion Club, which will operate under the parent club's authority with flexible meeting requirements and reduced membership dues. The board approved the companion club bylaws with a requirement for two monthly meetings, though the exact membership fee structure still needs to be determined. The discussion also covered the club's current membership report format, which Roger will revise to focus on positive engagement rather than just attendance tracking, and an update on grant qualification requirements that need to be completed by April for future Rotary grant applications.

## Next steps

- Wanda: Check with the district to determine if the parent club's bylaws need to be amended to allow for the companion club, and if so, send out a notification to the whole club membership for a vote on the bylaw amendment (including at least 7-day notice).
- Wanda: Send the approved companion club bylaws and required paperwork to Nadine for signature, then to Roger for submission to the district.
- Roger: Send the companion club bylaws and paperwork to the district once received from Wanda.
- Wanda: Discuss with Michael the possibility of forming a transition committee or assigning roles to support the launch of the companion club, and determine next steps for the transition.
- Wanda: Bring up the issue of separating donations and expenses in the club financial reports with Jessica (Treasurer) for her input.
- Wanda: Fill out and retrieve the blank check and leave at the PSU Field House for the game event.
- Wanda: Send a message to Jim to clarify ticket distribution and raffle details for the upcoming game event.
- Wanda and Roger: Present the Rotary Direct demo at next week's meeting.
- Wanda: Add the 6-month financial review report by Jessica to next week's club agenda.
- Michael: At upcoming training, seek guidance from other clubs that have implemented companion clubs and report back to the club.
- Wanda and Michael: Discuss the possibility of pursuing Rotary grants as a transitional project, including qualification and application requirements.

## Summary

### Club Bylaws and Financial Review

The meeting began with Wanda apologizing for not sending a meeting notice due to her absence in Vermont and technical difficulties. Roger expressed concern about the approval of the companion club, emphasizing the need for the club to modify its bylaws, which requires a membership vote. The group discussed the lack of a quorum and the absence of key members, including Jessica and Tom. With the confirmation of a quorum, the meeting proceeded to approve the previous minutes and discuss the treasurer's report, with Roger suggesting a need to create separate groupings for donations and expenses for clarity. The group agreed to conduct a 6-month financial review at the next meeting, and Wanda planned to add this to the agenda.

### Membership Report and Event Planning

Wanda and Roger discussed changes to the membership report format, with Roger considering alternatives to the current attendance-focused approach. They agreed to highlight positive aspects of membership engagement in future reports. Wanda provided an update on the upcoming game event, mentioning that 14 tickets have been reserved for their club and volunteers will be present at the table. They also discussed the need to clarify ticket distribution between their club and the Noon Club, with Wanda planning to follow up with Jim about the details.

### Companion Club Structure Overview

Wanda explained the purpose and structure of the Companion Club, emphasizing that it is not a separate entity but an extension of the Sunrise Rotary Club. She outlined the club's flexible meeting structure and leadership roles, which are subject to the authority of the parent club. Wanda also clarified that the Companion Club is designed to accommodate members who cannot commit to the current meeting schedule while maintaining the club's standards and administrative workload.

### Companion Club Financial Structure

The group discussed the establishment of a companion club, which could require companion club members to pay reduced dues around \$90 and operate under the parent club's financial oversight. Wanda explained that while the companion club would have minimal independence, all funds would flow through the parent club's account and decisions of the companion club would be made by consensus or majority vote. The group agreed to consult with Jessica about the fee structure, as they needed to ensure the companion club would not result in financial losses for the parent club.

### Rotary Club Bylaws Finalization

The meeting focused on finalizing the bylaws for the Rotary Companion Club of Plattsburgh Sunrise. The group approved the bylaws with a modification to include a minimum of two meetings per month, as suggested by the district. They discussed the flexible nature of the club, allowing members to participate in service projects without regular attendance. The club will use the parent club's Zoom access and

calendar for meetings. Roger was tasked with submitting the approved bylaws to the district, along with another required document signed by Nadine and Wanda.

## Rotary Companion Club Formation Discussion

Wanda and Roger discussed the formation of a companion Rotary club, with Wanda agreeing to check with the district about whether their bylaws need to be changed to accommodate the new club. They agreed that while the board has approved the bylaws, they should present it to the general membership for an official vote. Michael suggested forming a yearly committee to guide the new club, with Wanda and Michael planning to discuss the details further. The group thought that the club had already voted to proceed with the companion club last year, and Michael offered to seek guidance from other clubs that had similar arrangements.

## Grant Qualification and Club Updates

The club discussed grant qualification modules that were recently received, with Roger explaining that becoming qualified requires completing both RI and district qualifications, though the club has shown little interest in grants over the years. Michael shared his past experience with grant training but noted he hasn't actually completed a grant himself. Wanda expressed interest in pursuing grants, citing her experience with obtaining \$100,000+ grants from New York State and SUNY, and she agreed to discuss the possibility with Michael. The conversation ended with an update that Brian, who recently had spine surgery and is stepping down as dean of the School of Business effective August, will be absent from club activities for the time being.

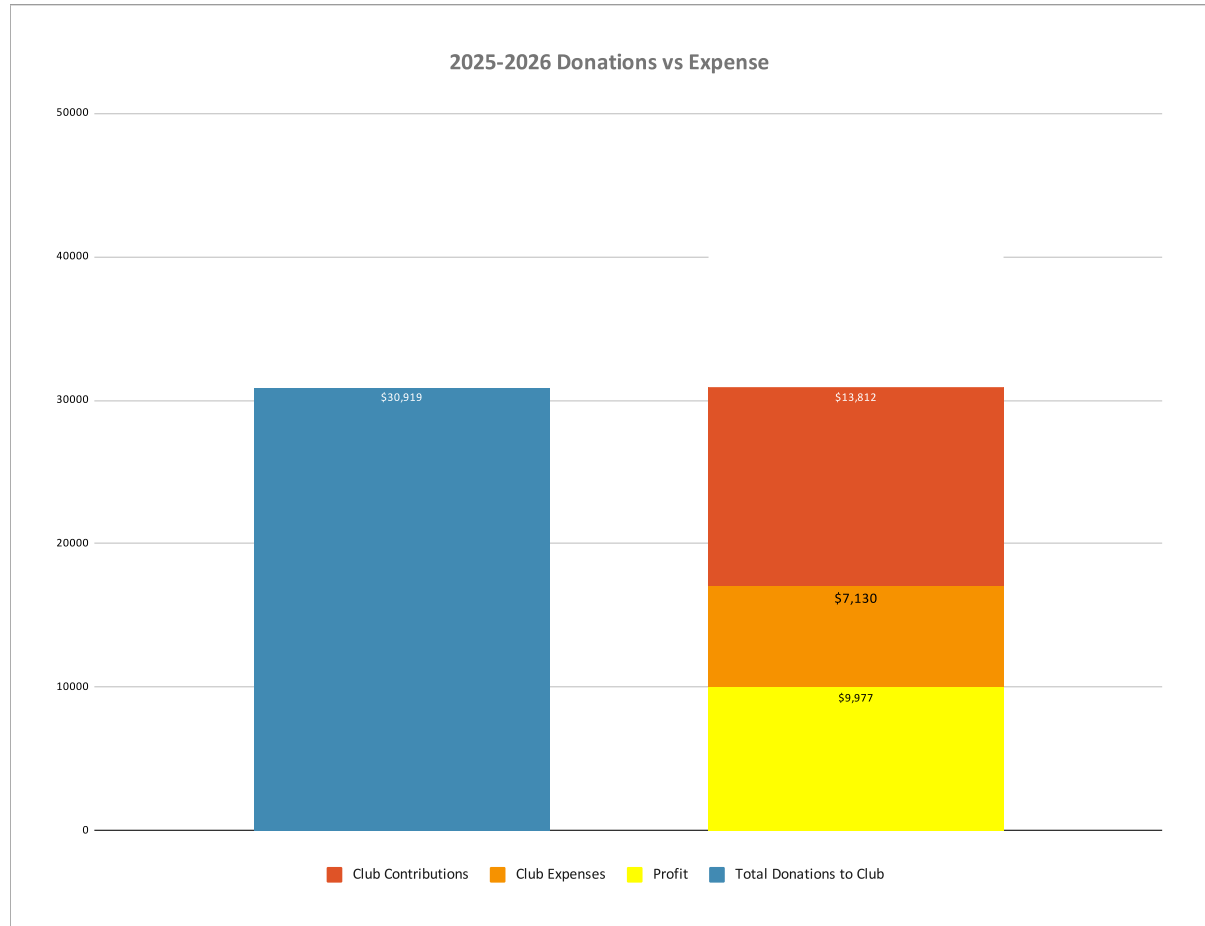

Meeting summary - Membership & Fellowship Committee meeting 2/12/26

### Quick recap

The membership and fellowship committee met to discuss website improvements and member engagement initiatives. Joanne and Alicia from the Public Image and Communications Committee shared updates on website redesign efforts, including making the site more mobile-friendly and better promoting events like Mayor's Cup. The group reviewed a new mentorship checklist for incoming members and discussed the need to formalize the definition of "Friends of the Club." They also addressed upcoming events, including a hockey game fundraising table and a chamber breakfast on March 17th, which led to a decision to move their regular club meeting to the following Tuesday. The conversation ended with discussion of the companion club initiative and plans for a centennial milestone dinner on March 14th.

### Next steps

- Roger: Duplicate the JotForm membership forms using Google Forms and update the website links before the JotForm subscription expires (by end of month or a week before).
- Roger: Take responsibility for maintaining and updating the club's online calendar with all meetings, committee meetings, and events.
- Ian: Update the new member mentorship checklist to incorporate assigning specific onboarding tasks to relevant members/roles (not just mentors), add member talk, and remove/adjust classification talk and Club Runner as appropriate; reshare with the committee and place on next month's agenda for review.
- Wanda: Add "Friends of Sunrise" discussion to the agenda for the next meeting to gather input and form a small working group to define and implement the "Friend of the Club" status.
- Wanda: Forward the Noon Club Centennial milestone dinner announcement to Ian and add mention of the event to the next meeting agenda.
- Wanda: Offer to host Barbara Fisk the night before Mayor's Cup and connect with her to confirm arrangements.
- Ian: Put out a call for additional volunteers to help with the Rotary table at the hockey game.
- Wanda: Give a community update at the next meeting in lieu of a guest speaker, using information from Catholic Charities Ogdensburg.
- Wanda: Update the next meeting agenda to reflect the March 17th meeting change (move to 24th, encourage attendance at Chamber breakfast), and ensure Alicia includes this in the next bulletin.
- Roger: Change the online meeting schedule to reflect the new dates (March 17th social/Chamber, March 24th regular meeting).
- Wanda: Bring up the Centennial milestone dinner at the next meeting and encourage group/table reservations.
- Ian: At the next meeting, provide an update on the hockey game and confirm logistics with Jim regarding table setup and materials.
- Wanda: Send message to Rich Gottschall inviting him to a future morning meeting.
- Roger: Walk through Rotary Direct at the next meeting under Fundraising/Rotary Foundation.
- Wanda: Add tag sale volunteer recruitment to the next meeting agenda under Fundraising.
- Ian: Test/verify website analytics setup (GA4/Club Runner) in a couple of weeks to ensure data is being collected.
- Wanda: After mentorship checklist is finalized, have Libby and Alicia review for branding, color, font, and logo consistency.

### Summary

#### Meeting Agenda Discussion

Wanda suggested Ian run the meeting in Randy's absence, and Ian confirmed he had the agenda. The group discussed a checklist that Wanda mentioned Ian had, and Alicia joined the conversation briefly. No significant decisions or action items were mentioned in this segment.

### Website Updates and Content Strategy

Joanne D. and Alicia B. of the Public Image and Communications Committee discussed website updates with the membership committee, focusing on improving the site's functionality and messaging. Joanne shared recent changes to

the website, including updated links and quick access for members, while Roger announced the cancellation of their JotForm subscription and plans to transition to Google Forms. Alicia emphasized the importance of promoting events and keeping content concise, suggesting that the website should highlight the club's community involvement and recent achievements. The group agreed to continue working on aligning the website with strategic goals and to seek feedback from members on what content should be prioritized.

### **Website Enhancements and Calendar Updates**

The meeting focused on improving the club's website and calendar functionality. Roger proposed making the companion club a prominent feature on the website for the next six months and ensuring all club meetings and events are listed on the calendar. Ian suggested spending time discussing processes to make the website updates less burdensome for the marketing committee. The group also discussed website analytics, with Libby having set up tracking through Club Runner, and Ian emphasized the importance of understanding user needs without making assumptions. Roger noted that the current website design, while attractive to potential members, is not smartphone-friendly, which needs to be addressed.

### **Membership Committee Meeting Updates**

The membership committee discussed several key items including rescheduling their March 17th meeting due to the Chamber breakfast conflict, with plans to hold it on March 24th instead. They reviewed a new mentorship checklist developed by Ian, which aims to provide more consistent onboarding for new members, with Roger suggesting that mentors should delegate some tasks to other club members. The committee also discussed defining "Friends of the Club" status, with Roger noting that about 2-3 current members rarely attend meetings but maintain their membership, and agreed to bring this topic to a general meeting for discussion. Additionally, they confirmed plans for the hockey game fundraising event, with Wanda and others planning to arrive at 6:15 PM to help with the table setup and 50-50 raffle, which will benefit the scholarship fund.
